A major focus in my program is my daily reading of Al-Anon literature. The very first piece of literature I began reading was "From Survival to Recovery". As I began reading the pages I couldn't believe how much of my own story I was reading. I hadn't realized that many of my behaviors were adapted to survive. It was clear that the time had come to work on recovering. The book was eye opening and I find with each piece of CAL, my eyes open a little wider. I love getting new books so it didn't take long for me to accumulate a library of CAL. I have all three of the daily readers and enjoy reading them. Reading the literature brings a sense of calm and understanding to me. In fact, it is obvious when I get into a rut and am not doing my daily readings because my calm departs and is replaced with anxiety and irritability. It is amazing to me the power the literature has in my life! My husband and I decided to offer our boys two program pamphlets to read, "Youth and the Alcoholic Parent" and "Facts about Alateen". This was the beginning of opening their eyes to the life they have been living as well. Now my oldest son is also a grateful member of the program, he attends his Alateen meetings each week and looks forward to them just as much as I look forward to my Al-Anon meetings. We have all three programs working in our home and all working together. I feel privileged and incredible grateful to serve as our Area's Literature/Forum Coordinator. Reading and sharing about our literature has brought so much healing and recovery into my life and I look forward to increasing awareness to help others have the same!


